Web Service Update – Lance Vowell

OSTI is changing the 241.1 Form to include web services for data centers like ARM (Atmospheric Radiation Measurement, an ORNL data center. This process may also change the way we harvest—PNNL is interested in beta-testing this approach. More details to follow.

OSTP Requests for Information – Sharon Jordan

In the America COMPETES Reauthorization Act of 2010, Congress tasked the Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP) and the National Science and Technology Council (NSTC) with reviewing, evaluating, and proposing federal public access policies and practices for peer reviewed scholarly publications. A Public Access to Scholarly Publications (PASP) Task Force has been leading this effort on behalf of the NSTC, and a **Request for Information** (RFI) (i.e., an opportunity for stakeholder input) has just been **announced** by the White House seeking your input to the government's public access policy.

Responses to the RFI will be accepted through January 2, 2012, and can be sent to **publicaccess@ostp.gov**. The RFI has 8 thought-provoking questions (many with "sub-questions"). Please consider answering as many as seem pertinent to your perspective. This is an opportunity to participate and help shape public access policy. Let your voice be heard!

New Media Update – Judy Gilmore/Jannean Elliott

Science Cinema, using Microsoft's MAVIS software, is expanding. Non-MAVIS items that can't be auto-indexed will be added, and this change should make Science Cinema much more robust. In the past, "donors" needed about 200 hours of video to get it indexed. In the future, the number of hours will be much smaller, enabling things like videos from one conference to be submitted. Plus, the system will be capable of handling non-STI. We are encouraged to get into Energy Citations Database and enter the author name Saul Perlmutter—you can go right to a 90-minute video of Dr. Perlmutter discussing the research that won him this year's Nobel Prize in Physics.
