









SUBJECT: DOE Line of Succession

The Secretary should establish a "line of succession" within the Department. To date, existing procedures state that the Assistant Secretary for Intergovernmental and Institutional Relations -- now irrelevant -- follows the Deputy Secretary and Under Secretary with the Assistant Secretary for International Affairs the "next in line."

For your information, Section 202 of Public Law 95-91 (Department of Energy Organization Act) states "...The Deputy Secretary shall act for and exercise the functions of the Secretary during the absence or disability of the Secretary or in the event the office of Secretary becomes vacant. The Secretary shall designate the order in which the Under Secretary and other officials shall act for and perform the functions of the Secretary during the absence or disability of both the Secretary and Deputy Secretary or in the event of vacancies in both of those offices...."

I believe Secretary Duncan would want to designate succession lineage. Following are the Principals involved and their ranking should be determined by The Secretary:

All the above are Presidential nominees/Senate confirmation appointments and should be considered within the sphere of succession. As you will note, neither the Chairman, Federal Regulatory Administration or Secretarial appointees are listed.

The establishment of succession should specifically designate, with definitive stipulations, as to whom is "Acting Secretary" and within what time frame. For example, if The Secretary is out of town or the country for a period of 24 hours, should a designation of "Acting Secretary" be implemented?

For your information, there are times when all OSE Principals, as well as numerous DOE Principals, are out of the city or country; hence, the importance of the line of succession.

I would like to discuss this matter fully with you.
