3. Relationships With Other Agencies

a. U. S. Army Chemical Corps Advisory Council

(1) Dr. Carl B. Marquand, Executive Director of the U. S. Army Chemical Corps Advisory Council, participated in the 139th American Chemical Society National Meeting held 21-30 March 1961 in St. Louis, Missouri, by presenting a paper prepared by himself and Helen H. Marquand entitled "Another European Gibbs Medalist -- Svante August Arrhenius." At the Divisional Officers' Meeting on 25 March, Dr. Marquand represented Dr. Virgil Payne, Chairman of the Division of the History of Chemistry; and he attended the Council Meeting of the American Chemical Society as an alternate for Dr. Aaron Inde, of the University of Wisconsin.

(2) Dr. Carl B. Marquand was one of the representatives of the U. S. Army Chemical Corps at the meeting of the Ad Hoc Committee on Nonmilitary Defense of the National Academy of Sciences-National Research Council, Division of Chemistry and Chemical Technology, which met in the Reading Room of the National Academy of Sciences, Washington, D. C., on 12 January 1961.

(3) The Advisory Council Office received a letter dated 12 December 1960 from Marshall K. Hunter, president of the First National Bank, Anniston, Alabama, who is also chairman of the Military Affairs Committee, and chairman of the Army Advisory Committee, in which he stated:

"It was a source of considerable pride to our community that the U. S. Army Chemical Corps Advisory Council chose the Chemical installation at Fort McClellan (Ala.) for its meeting place [on 8-9 December 1960]. We deeply regret that the very busy schedule of your group did not permit you to spend at least an hour or two down town with some of our manufacturers and other people.... Our entire community is quite cognizant of the importance of the Chemical Corps installation here, and wants to go on record with your group that we want to render our full support to any activities connected with the Chemical Corps installation...."

b. Protective Committee

Dr. James N. Pitts, Professor of Chemistry, Division of Physical Sciences, University of California (Riverside), has a Guggenheim Fellowship in Europe this year, with principal place of study at Oxford, England. In order that Dr. Pitts be of value to the Chemical Corps by learning first hand of the U. K. programs at Porton, a letter to this effect, dated 9 December 1960, was sent to the Chemical Representative, U. S. Army Standardization Group, U.K., by Dr. Gordon L. Bushey, Scientific Assistant to the Deputy Chief Chemical Officer for Scientific Activities.

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c. Medical Committee

Dr. Herbert E. Longenecker assumed his duties as President of Tulane University, New Orleans, La., in September 1960. He formerly was Vice-President of the University of Illinois, Chicago Professional Colleges, Chicago, Ill.
