HEALTH FACILITIES MODERNIZATION PROGRAM

During fiscal year 1975, twelve medical construction projects were submitted to the Congress for consideration. These included additions to Noble Army Hospital, Fort McClellan, AL; Ireland Army Hospital, Fort Knox, KY; and U. S. Army Hospital, Nuernberg, Germany. A new health clinic for Bamberg, Germany was proposed and eight dental clinics in the Continental United States were requested.

At the close of the fiscal year, health facility projects under construction included four new hospitals, six hospital alterations or additions, thirteen health, dental or combination clinics, and two hospital electrical/mechanical upgrade projects, totaling \$352.3 million in appropriations. Projects authorized but not yet under construction included two hospital alterations, four hospital electrical/mechanical upgrade projects, and two health/dental clinics, for an appropriated total value of \$65.2 million.

The two major projects under construction, the 1000-bed Walter Reed Army Medical Center and the 700-bed Dwight D. Eisenhower Army Medical Center, Fort Belvoir, CA, were 1.7% and 95% completed, respectively, at the fiscal year ended.

FEEDER MATERIAL STILL OUTSTANDING

To enhance the completeness of the Annual Report for FY 75 and its continuity with the FY 74 report, the following input would be desirable:

1. Except for a list of construction projects completed or underway no input was received from the Logistics and Facilities Division, Directorate of Health Care Operations. Additional information concerning plans and doctrine, development of new logistics systems, and supply operations is needed. For example, the further development and/or extension of the SAILS A/B (X) program, the AMEDD Property Accounting System (AMEDDPAS), the Standard Army Maintenance System (SAMS), and the Tri-Service Medical Information System (TRIMIS). Also needed are statistics to update the Army Stock Fund and MEDCASE programs.
2. Information from the Psychiatry and Pharmacy Consultants.
3. Progress report on the implementation of the Family Practice Program.
4. Additional information from the Veterinary Corps; specifically, statistics pertaining to the food inspection program (no. of lbs. inspected, no. of inspections, etc.).
5. Information on legislation introduced, pending, or passed by Congress which is of importance to AMEDD operations. No input was received in this area.



Hospital Construction Projects

During FY 1975, the following hospital construction project was completed:

Patterson Army Hospital, Fort Monmouth, NJ: Clinic Addition.

Six hospital construction projects were started in FY 1975 as follows:

- a. US Army Hospital, US Military Academy, West Point, NY: New hospital, 65 beds.
- b. Yanner Army Hospital, Fort Lee, VA: Clinic Addition.
- c. US Army Hospital, Redstone Arsenal, AL: New hospital, 70 beds.
- d. Irwin Army Hospital, Fort Riley, KS: Clinic Addition.
- e. DeWitt Army Hospital, Fort Belvoir, VA: Electrical/Mechanical Upgrade.
- f. Dunham Army Hospital, Carlisle Barracks, PA: Electrical/Mechanical Upgrade.
