1. (U) The attached letter from the Commanding General, U. S. Army CmlC, Research and Development Command, CMLRD-R, dated 23 October 1959, subject as above, approves the use of volunteers in our non-lethal agent research program.

2. (C) In your implementation of this approval, the following guide lines are to be observed:

a. Volunteer studies will be conducted only on:

- (1) EA 2148 and its homologs
- (2) EA 1476 and its homologs
- (3) LSD 25
- (4) CS
- (5) Benzilates

b. Tests on any compound other than those delineated above involving volunteers must be approved by this office (non-lethal agents). Where prior approval has not been received from The Surgeon General, the procedure outlined in paragraph 2 of the attached letter will be followed.

c. Volunteer tests that are to be accomplished under USA CWL contracts must comply with the same procedure as followed in our in-house program.
