MEMORANDUM FOR THE ASSISTANT TO THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE (ATOMIC ENERGY)

SUBJECT: Locating Records of DoD Human Radiation Experiments

Reference: ATSD (Atomic Energy) Memorandum, 31 January 1994, subject as above.

1. This forwards the Defense Intelligence Agency's reply to the referenced memorandum requesting an initial two-part report that identifies organizations which might have conducted or sponsored human radiation experiments, records of such experiments, and specific information on those experiments.

2. **PART I:**

a. The Defense Intelligence Agency has no elements which, based on their missions and activities, might have conducted or sponsored human radiation experiments. Nevertheless, for the purpose of completeness, we have searched all hardcopy and automated databases, current and archived, as well as current and archived message data bases and library data bases belonging to the National Military Intelligence Production Center (NMIPC). These elements include the Directorate for Military Assessments, including the Missile and Space Intelligence Center and the Armed Forces Medical Intelligence Center; the Directorate for Combat Support; and the Directorate for Operations.

b. The records belonging to the organizations listed above are located at the Defense Intelligence Analysis Center, the Pentagon, and the Navy Yard in the metropolitan Washington area, and at Redstone Arsenal in Alabama and at Ft. Detrick in Maryland.

c. The files and databases belonging to each organization listed were searched both manually and electronically by employees designated for this purpose, for information relating to any possible experiments.

d. Based on the results of this search, no records were found that indicated DIA might have conducted or sponsored human radiation experiments.

3. **PART II** requests additional information on specific radiation experiments identified in PART I, and therefore is not applicable to DIA.
