SUBJECT: Renewal of Negotiated Contract No. DA-49-007-MD-99,  
Medical College of Virginia, AW-6, 6-59-08-004

1. In compliance with Paragraph 1-605, Army Procurement Procedure, authority is requested for the use of negotiation and approval of award of increase to subject contract by \$223,333 as follows:

- a. 1-605a(1): Medical College of Virginia, Richmond, Virginia.
- b. 1-605a(2): Medical College of Virginia Hospitals.
- c. 1-605a(3): Contract No. DA-49-007-MD-99, Modification No. 7.

d. 1-605a(4): This is the principal and most important Army project for laboratory and clinical studies of all phases of thermal burns and thermal burns complicated by radiation and traumatic injuries, of the types anticipated in atomic warfare. The study provides clinical patients and special burn wards in three large hospitals (Medical College of Virginia Hospital, St. Philip's Hospital, and Dooley Hospital), complete laboratory facilities, and a complete staff of clinical and laboratory experts. It further provides the most complete studies of the nutritional aspects of burns and radiation conducted anywhere in the United States. At a recent review by the National Research Council, this study was considered to have made outstanding contributions to the nature of thermal burns and their care. The entire program is monitored by the Committee on Surgery and the Subcommittee on Burns of the National Research Council, and is reviewed by the Committee on Medical Sciences, Research and Development Board, Department of Defense.
