Dear Dr. Green:

Thank you for your letter of November 4, 1966, relating to the 114th meeting of the Advisory Committee for Biology and Medicine. We are particularly grateful that the Committee is taking such a direct interest in the problem of possible genetic effects of products of irradiated carbohydrate solutions following human ingestion and I hope the Committee will continue to assist us in resolving the problem.

As to the exploitation of short half-life isotopes in biology and medicine, the Commission will encourage the staff in its efforts to accomplish this but, of course, must bear in mind the budgetary restrictions within which we operate these days.

I am asking the staff of the Division of Biology and Medicine to make a study of how to take fullest advantage of the opportunities at the Commission's laboratories for the development of theoretical biology. They will report to you the results of their study at a future meeting.

We welcome your help in locating a suitable successor to Dr. Dunham. Perhaps you can suggest potential candidates and give us your comments regarding them. We will appreciate your thoughts as early as possible.

I shall look forward to the report of the meeting of the ACBM held recently at Oak Ridge.
