1. D. Mack reviewed his interpretation of the current status of the Donner Laboratory Nuclear Medicine Program with reference to the current information that has been gathered for the Potchen Committee. The preliminary draft of this report will be sent to Washington in October with expectation of a final draft by December 1975 or early January 1976.

After discussion, objections, counter-objections, review of the possible total dollars involved (estimates of Donner involved money: possibly \$250,000-\$300,000) in programs effected by the Potchen review, it was decided that Budinger and Born would summarize the Nuclear Medicine Program at Donner Laboratory in order to bring up to date the information which is going to Washington.

2. Budinger presented to the group several charts which described the efforts of the various Medical Programs of the Donner Laboratory and the scientific staff which was involved in these various programs. The former was designed to illustrate new programs which have developed since the PEER REVIEW and also included on-going Medical Programs to show their inter-relationships. The latter (chart of the scientific staff) listed individuals (some new additions and some possible vacancies) and showed the involvement of individuals on one or more projects. Some of these new programs have developed because of grant money obtained by the scientific staff.
3. Budinger, Linfoot, Sargent, and McRae added specific comments about the Medical Programs with which they are involved.
4. The comment arose that a Fee-for-Service would be attempted on the next pituitary therapy group, possibly in October 1975.
