On October 18, 1951, the attached report, submitted to Mr. Corley by Colonel Haley, was presented to the Regents' Atomic Energy Project Sub-Committee, consisting of Regents McLaughlin and Neylan. This report was in turn submitted to the Regents by Regent Neylan through the Regents' Atomic Energy Projects Committee. With the exception of Item 6, referring to a police union, the report was accepted.

On the matter of a police union, the Regents directed that the administrative officers of the University not recognize a police union, either at the Radiation Laboratory or on the Berkeley Campus, unless they are so directed by the Regents at a future date. All concerned should be guided accordingly.

Pursuant to the foregoing action by the Regents the attached directive, Re: Announcement of Establishment of the Radiation Laboratory Police, Berkeley Campus," dated October 31, 1951, is furnished you. It is requested that the action called for in the directive, also in paragraphs 3, 4, 5, 7 and 8 of the Haley report, be expedited, especially that regarding procurement of an R.L.P. Commander.

It will be noted that the R.L.P. becomes a separate unit on November 1, 1951, and that personnel and pay matters should be adjusted accordingly.
