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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

A meeting was held on April 18, 1975, at M11 Wheeler Hall. In attendance were Dr. Andrew M. Sessler, Director, Lawrence Berkeley Laboratory (LBL); Mr. George Pappas, Associate Director, LBL; Dr. James Born, Director, Donner Laboratory (DL); Dr. James McRae, Research Physician, DL; Mr. Baird Whaley, Assistant to Director, DL; Professor Herbert P. Phillips, Chairman, Committee for Protection of Human Subjects (CPHS); and Mrs. Lorraine McGraw, Executive Officer, CPHS.

The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the issues raised in Chairman Phillips' letter of January 28, 1975, to Dr. Sessler, (Appendix I) and Dr. Sessler's response of April 2, 1975, to Professor Phillips, (Appendix II with attachments).

It was determined that the Berkeley CPHS will assume the official responsibility for review and approval of all LBL activities (including ERDA projects) which involve the use of human subjects as set forth in the following:

- a. The regulations issued by DHEW on the protection of human subjects.
- b. The November 8, 1972, Berkeley Policy and Procedures Governing the Protection of Human Subjects.
- c. The March 29, 1972, directive by President Hitch - Policy on Research Involving Human Subjects (with attachments).
- d. Any subsequent revisions to the above cited documents.

It was further determined that LBL will appoint an advisory committee to assist the Berkeley CPHS in their review of LBL projects, provide two research scientists to serve as Committee members on the Berkeley CPHS, and to provide such financial support as is consonant with the administrative action required in the review of LBL protocols, (the exact amount of such financial support to be negotiated at a later date).

Each institution agrees to keep the other informed of issues or matters of mutual concern or interest for the protection of the rights and welfare of human subjects.

This Memorandum of Understanding will be subject to review or amendment every two (2) years or at more frequent intervals as mutually deemed necessary, or may be terminated by either party following notice of termination. The

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notice of termination shall be in writing and shall take effect as soon thereafter as reasonably possible and shall allow LBL sufficient time to receive DHEW approval of a general assurance of compliance, but in any case shall not exceed twelve (12) months from the date of such notice.
