Dr. Albert Tannenbaum has been asked to come on the Argonne National Laboratory payroll for approximately two months beginning during the first two weeks in July and terminating almost certainly on or before September 16, 1946.

Dr. Tannenbaum, during the past four years, has worked part time for the Metallurgical Laboratory. His work on toxicological problems has been invaluable and has contributed greatly to the success of the project.

Dr. Tannenbaum has been asked to go to Bikini to participate in the second test there. It is for this reason that he, at this time, has been asked to come on the payroll.

In the past, Dr. Tannenbaum has been paid in part by the Michael Reese Hospital, and in part by the Metallurgical Laboratory. It is proposed that his salary per month be one twelfth of his annual salary from both of the above sources since he will be working full time for the Argonne National Laboratory. In the past Dr. Tannenbaum has been employed by the Metallurgical Laboratory as a senior physician. His salary at that time was based on the assumption that his annual income was well over [REDACTED]. There seems to be no valid reason for asking him to accept a reduction in salary for doing this work for the Argonne National Laboratory.
