It is our desire to get some information regarding a physicist, who at one time was working at your project. is suspected of having berylliosis and we would appreciate receiving any information that may be readily available regarding this individual.

We are especially interested in obtaining the following information:

1. Length of employment and name of employer while at your project.
2. Nature and extent of his duties at your project.
3. Did ever work with beryllium? If so how much time did he spend in this work. The type of work and kind of exposures such as grinding, dry powder, wet chemistry, fumes, etc.
4. What other harmful dusts, gases, or filaments was he known to have been exposed to. We are especially interested in any of these that may be known to be injurious to the lungs.
5. Any personal history that may be available such as educational background, marital status, age, special interest, hobbies, etc.
6. Name and address of previous employers including period of employment and nature of duties available.

We would appreciate receiving a report in this case at a very early date.

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
