1. General Situation

a. This Operation Plan is issued in implementation of Commander, Joint Task Force SEVEN Operation Plan #1-58. Operation HARDTACK will be a series of approximately 27 atomic tests to be conducted in the Eniwetok Proving Ground during the spring and summer of 1958. For shot schedule

supervises operation of Holmes & Narver medical facilities, personnel office, rad-safe operations, recreation facilities and activities, safety programs, security office; and furnishes the Senior

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ing, internal audit, material and property accounting, and payroll and timekeeping.

(4) TU-4 - Operates Holmes & Narver engineering and design office, estimating and analysis department, survey operations, material testing facilities, and AE construction inspection service.

(5) TU-5 - Performs construction and maintenance through Area Superintendent. Provides carpenters, electricians, heavy equipment operators, mechanics, plumbers, sheet metal workers, painters, sandblasters, and steel workers to perform EPG construction and maintenance as directed.

(6) TU-6 - Operates camp facilities at all EPG locations except FRED and JAPTAN Islands. Supervises Holmes & Narver marine operations and power and distillation operations.

(7) TU-7 - Operates Holmes & Narver supply activities, including material control, material coordination, material take-off, property, stevedoring, and warehousing.

c. All Headquarters and Task Unit Commanders are responsible:

(1) For the radiological safety of their personnel.

(2) That personnel under their command comply with jobsite health and safety directives.

(3) That personnel under their command are adequately instructed for emergency operations prescribed in jobsite Natural Disaster, Hostile Alert, and Evacuation Plans.

(4) That personnel under their command comply with current security regulations.

d. For security procedures, rad-safe procedures, Natural Disaster Plan, Hostile Alert Plan, and pre-shot camp evacuation procedure see TG 7.5 SOP.

e. Reports - as directed later.

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4. Administration

a. Continue normal administration as prescribed in United States Atomic Energy Commission Contract AT(29-2)-20, AEC Manuals, and TG 7.5 SOP.

b. Camp locations on BIKINI Atoll:

- (1) NAN - Main camp
- (2) OBOE - Temporary camp
- (3) HOW - Temporary camp for TEAK and ORANGE events.
- (4) GEORGE - Small temporary camp for TEAK and ORANGE events.

c. Camp locations on ENIWETOK Atoll:

- (1) ELMER - Permanent establishment
- (2) FRED - Permanent establishment
- (3) JANET - Temporary camp
- (4) YVONNE - Temporary camp

5. Command and Signal

a. Signal - As prescribed in TG 7.5 SOP, Chapter 0270.

b. Command relationships - See Chapter 0101, TG 7.5 SOP.

c. Command Posts.

- (1) Forward - Building 208, PARRY Island, ENIWETOK.

Building 15, NAN Island, BIKINI.

USS Boxer - When required.
