Mr. Dunlap and Mr. Hinch called my attention to a condition this morning which will be promptly corrected but which has indicated a need for future planning.

The condition I refer to is the over-filling of the activated refuse material pit which was provided on South Point just southeast of the coal storage piles about a year ago. This pit has not been used as was originally intended and as a result the cartons of refuse are piled high above the ground and are disintegrating which means that a considerable quantity of them will have to be moved to one of the new pits and the old pit covered with earth. This, as I say, has been arranged for.

It was the consensus of opinion of those of us who surveyed the situation this morning that it would be highly desirable to reserve a 200' by 400' space adjacent to and just east of the old pit fence line as shown on the attached sketch for the provision of four more additional pits if that should become necessary due to a more rapid filling of the new pits than has been anticipated or if it should become necessary to abandon the new pits when partially filled because of the exposure of the new DP plant to excessive dust when the pits are back filled.

I am not familiar with the procedure necessary to assure the reservation of this space, but I am sure you will know how this should be done. The location is excellent for such a purpose and it would be a shame not to hold it open for the future.
