The following security regulations I and II have been arranged by Major de Silva's office and should be brought to the attention of the men in your group who will be going to Trinity.

I Trinity Security Regulations

"a. Departing groups or individuals will stop by Major de Silva's office for an explanation of security objectives at Trinity. This will be done immediately before departure. Each individual need receive this explanation only once, but will receive it regardless of the number of previous trips to Trinity. This talk will be given by Lt. R. A. Taylor.

"b. All personnel going to Trinity will sleep and eat at the camp site, and not in nearby towns. The practice of eating and sleeping at the local hotel will be stopped at once. Lt. Howard Bush advises that he is equipped to provide these services to all persons.

"c. While at Trinity, recreation trips for movies, dinners, etc., to nearby towns will not be made by any personnel. Officers and enlisted men are under military orders which prohibit such activities, and civilians are expected to comply to the letter and the spirit of this rule.

"d. There will be a civilian representative of my office at Trinity at all times after 15 February 1945. This person will carry a letter identification signed by me, and may be called on for advice in security matters. He will also aid in providing official communication facilities, after requests for same have been cleared through Lt. Bush.

"e. Questions regarding laundry, mail, cleaning, etc., should be referred to Lt. Bush, or, in his absence, my representative."

II Pass System at Trinity

"1. Prior to initial departure for Trinity all Site Y personnel will secure a pass from Lt. R. A. Taylor of this office.

"2. This pass will be presented at the guard house at the base of the first guard tower, where it will be exchanged for a badge. This badge must be worn at all times while at Trinity. The pass will be held at the aforementioned guard house until departure from Trinity.

"3. Upon departure from Trinity the badge will be exchanged for the original pass at the guard house. All passes will be returned to Lt. Taylor upon arrival at Site Y."



"4. Guards will be instructed to honor the pass issued by Lt. Taylor if the bearer thereof is apprehended at any point along the main road between the outer boundary of the area and the first guard tower. At all other points within the area a badge must be worn if apprehension is to be avoided.

"5. Admission of visitors to Trinity who may not come to Site Y prior to the visit will be arranged through Lt. Bush by contacting him from the first guard tower. In all such cases this office should be advised in advance of the visit in order that proper arrangements for admission may be made with Lt. Bush.

III Notification to Lt. Bush of Proposed Trips

Lt. Bush has requested that he be notified one or two days in advance of the possible arrival at Trinity of five or more people. This notification should be made through Lt. Taylor's office. Lt. Taylor will telephone Lt. Bush.
