**MEMORANDUM:**

To: Commander F.I. Winant, CTG 7.6  
From: Darel Froman  
Subj: Preparations for X Day.

1. There will be a weapons carrier for the exclusive use of your disaster party on X-1 day during the forenoon. It will be parked near the tank revetment.

2. Linsenberger and Ogle had expected to use and will use rubber gloves for washing their samples.

3. Shielding of the winch operator from the cable wound on the drum is impractical. However, this operator does not stand at the winch while it is in operation, but only near by.

4. It is more convenient for Ogle to sit near the door of the helicopter than for the monitor to sit there. Ogle will investigate if he can change seats with the monitor and still operate the radio equipment. It strikes me as rather a quibble whether Ogle or the monitor first get out of the helicopter on grounding near the winch, but we will put the monitor next to the door if it is feasible.

5. Mr. Bowman and I will supply you with our wishes with respect to the intensity level we would like the helicopter to work at if necessary, during the tank operation. This is an urgent mission and may require working for one-half or one hour at a level resulting in a dose up to three roentgens.

6. Mr. A.W. Kelly represents TU 7.1.1 on the handling of medical examinations paper work. Mr. Kelly is also arranging for better food etc. on Parry Island and Mr. Graves should be contacted directly on Parry for monitor transportation.
