 Telephone Call Between Dr. George V. LeRoy and Dr. Marks on 4/26/74. Dr. LeRoy
 is Professor of Medicine at the University of Chicago.

On 4/26/74, I received a telephone call from Dr. George V. LeRoy of the University of Chicago. Dr. LeRoy had been asked by Dr. Leon O. Jacobson during the interview of 4/16/74 to examine the hospital records on the Chicago cases CAL-1 and CAL-2 for evidence of disclosure to the patients. Dr. LeRoy was then to report his findings to me.

The call on 4/26/74 concerned the chart of CAL-2. Dr. LeRoy stated that he found only two relevant pieces of information in the hospital chart. One was a note written by a medical student to the effect that the family was anxious for the patient to be started on plutonium treatment. The second was a note stating that "U" medicine was initiated. I failed to ask him what the date of the second note was in relation to the known time of the plutonium injection. Editorial comment: The patient was dying of cancer at this time. ^{Let} The note may be interpreted in one of two ways. Either the patient or family had been informed that the patient was to have a plutonium treatment or the patient or family was told that the patient was to have some kind of treatment which the medical student knew to be a plutonium injection.

Dr. LeRoy said that he had ^{not} ~~so~~ yet been unable to gain ^{ed} access to the chart on CAL-1 because it was being microfilmed, but he thought that it would probably become available in about a week.

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
