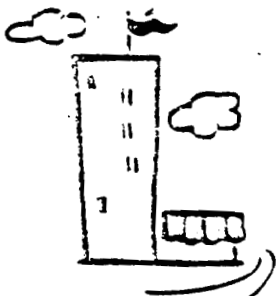

I have been Diabetic for seven years..I am now 22, and if I could by offering myself as a "Guinea Pig" aid in the advancement of knowledge concerning the treatment of diabetes by atomic medicine, I would be pleased to do so. I would be willing to sign away all responsibility for what might happen to me as the result of any such experiments and would consider the whole thing as being on my own shoulders. If you are interested I will promptly furnish you with a medical history of my case from the doctors who have taken care of me. I will be pleased to have a reply from you as soon as is possible. Thank you for any information you can give me on this matter.
