The purpose of this letter is to refer you to a letter dated July 9, 1976, from the people of Utirik to Mr. Roger Ray of ERDA at the Nevada Operations Office. We would also like to make reference to an earlier letter from Representative John Haglegem to you following the March survey. To date he has not received a response. Consequently, we should like to pose some questions, and seek some clarifications with regard to the Rongelap-Utirik issue.

Furthermore, we have heard that people of Rongelap and Utirik have complained that it was our Committee which said that no "descendants" of exposed persons would receive I.D. cards. Public Law No. 5-52, as amended by P.L. No. 5-80, indicates that descendants are covered under the law. However, the benefits are accorded to the people under the TPII-ERDA agreement. Those who would receive cards, would be those listed on the BNL roster. Furthermore, we recall that your position was that there was no reason to include descendants of exposed persons on the BNL roster for two reasons: 1) it was unlikely that any effects would be transmitted to subsequent generations, and 2) putting them on the roster and thus giving them I.D. cards would lead them to believe that they fell into the same dosage class as the exposed Rongelapese.




