Dear President Sproul:

Enclosed herewith is application to the American Cancer Society for a grant-in-aid in the amount of \$10,077.48 as submitted by Samuel H. Bassett, M.D., Clinical Professor of Medicine, for the purpose of conducting a research project entitled, "Chemical Studies on Human Plasma Proteins in Abnormal Conditions" for the period beginning July 1, 1955 and ending June 30, 1956.

The purpose of this research program is to isolate and study relatively pure protein subfractions using a technique which has only recently been developed and appears to be promising. Preliminary observations have been made on the chemical fractionation of the amino acid content of the isolated protein fractions. It is hoped that the results obtained will add to a better understanding of the current clinical findings in malignancies.

Facilities are available at the Veterans Administration Center and no additional space will be required on the UCLA campus. Nothing patentable is expected to result from this project.

Provision has been made for participation in the State Employees' Retirement System at the rate of 9% of applicable salaries, and the usual 8% for overhead as allowed by the American Cancer Society has been included.

Consideration of this request at the meeting of the Regents on August 27, 1954 will be very much appreciated. It is necessary that the application reach the Executive Secretary for the Committee on Growth, National Research Council, 2101 Constitution Avenue, Washington 25, D.C. by October 1 in order to be considered for activation by July 1, 1955. Your assistance in expediting this request will be of great help to us.
