Attached are four copies of a proposal submitted by Dr. John S. Lawrence of the Department of Medicine, School of Medicine, Los Angeles requesting \$6,890.00 of the California Division of the American Cancer Society in support of the research program entitled "Chemical Studies on Human Plasma Proteins in Malignant Disease" for a one-year period under the direction of Dr. Samuel H. Bassett. After the required approvals and signature of the President on the first page, two copies should be forwarded to the American Cancer Society, California Division, 467 O'Farrell Street, San Francisco 2, California, attention Medical and Scientific Director. The remaining copies are file copies.

Dr. Lawrence has indicated in his letter of March 14, attached that the purpose of this research program is to isolate and study relatively pure protein subfractions, using a technique which has only recently been developed and appears to be promising. A method for the chemical fractionation of the amino acid content of the isolated protein fractions has been set up in this laboratory, and some preliminary observations have been made. It is hoped that the results obtained will add to a better understanding of the current clinical findings in malignancies.

Dr. Lawrence has further indicated in his letter that facilities are available at the Veterans Administration Center, Sawtelle, and that no other activities will be displaced nor will there be other than normal use of utilities.

There is neither provision for participating in the State Employees' Retirement System nor for University overhead as it is contrary to the policies involved to request reimbursement of such expenditures. (The American Cancer Society does not provide for funds other than for the research program.)

We have been further informed that nothing of a hazardous nature is involved in this program; however, if hazards should arise, all necessary precautions will be taken to avoid damage to property or injury to personnel.

It is noted that applications have been made and grants received for this research program in that one is contemplated to the U. S. Public Health Service and one has been regretfully refused by the American Cancer Society. The Department of Medicine has indicated that the attached application is for funds for the period July 1, 1955 to June 30, 1956 and that other pending applications or proposals have been for either prior periods or will be for future periods.
