Attached are an original and two copies of a revised budget requested by the U. S. Public Health Service in connection with the above-described research grant. After any required approvals including the signature of the President (the official who signed the application originally submitted) the document should be forwarded as addressed on the envelope already provided by the Department of Medicine, School of Medicine, Los Angeles.

The letter dated July 16, 1954 from the U. S. Public Health Service indicates that the budget submitted with our letter to Chancellor Allen dated February 18 was reconsidered and the U. S. Public Health Service allocated funds in the amount of \$88,372.00 for the period July 1, 1954 to December 31, 1955 instead of the amounts for the two periods which were indicated in our original proposal. The U. S. Public Health Service requested a revised budget in accordance with the amount allocated per the letter of July 16.

The revised budget has been submitted to the Business Office and is satisfactory, which has been indicated by signing the original and initialing the two copies. The budget contains provision for participating in the State Employees' Retirement System as well as the allowable overhead of the U. S. Public Health Service and its approval is recommended as the Department has informed us that the research will continue at a somewhat slower pace than was originally contemplated, but that an adequate job can be done with the funds provided.
