Dear Dr. [REDACTED]:

This is to confirm my letter of August 8, 1951, concerning your trip to Chicago to discuss with representatives of our Laboratory your original work with the use of radium. We are very much interested in having you come at any time most convenient for you. We would like to have you go through our clinic while you are here.

The examination will consist of taking your complete history, a physical examination, breathing tests, complete X-rays, and other related laboratory tests. All of this information will be given to you upon your request.

The Laboratory will reimburse you for the cost of the trip as follows:

1. The actual cost of your transportation to Chicago and return.
2. The actual cost of your hotel accommodations while in Chicago (the Laboratory will arrange hotel accommodations for you, if you wish).
3. The actual cost of your local transportation and a per diem allowance of \$8.00 in lieu of the actual costs of your meals, tips and incidental expenses. This per diem is based on a twenty-four hour day and will be pro-rated on the basis of 1/4 day after the first twenty-four hour period.
4. A fee of \$25.00 per day to compensate you for coming to Chicago.

It is understood by you that the Argonne National Laboratory is operated by The University of Chicago under a Government contract with the United States Atomic Energy Commission, and it is agreed that the obligation of said parties to you shall be limited to the items of reimbursement set forth in this letter.

If the arrangements as outlined in this letter are satisfactory to you, kindly sign your name in the lower left hand corner of the two extra copies of this letter. You may return them to me by mail in the enclosed, self-addressed envelope.

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Again may we thank you for your cooperation in this very important problem.
