Dear Dr. Warren:

After our meeting last Thursday, I called Dr. Brucer at Oak Ridge. The result of this conversation answered all of the questions which you and I brought up in our discussion, namely:

- 1) A check for \$2500 can come from the City of Hope. The type of arrangement can be informal. It is not necessary to mention anything about the special Medical Research Advisory Committee.
- 2) It is not necessary to mention the question of additional personnel. However, Dr. Brucer stated that it was customary to appoint an alternate after the project was established.
- 3) It is not necessary to mention the question of complying with the regulations of the A. E. C. in this letter.

One additional point was brought out, that the letter should not be written to Dr. Brucer but to Dr. William G. Pollard, who acts as an administrator of the program. I read a suggested letter to Dr. Brucer which he felt would be satisfactory and I am enclosing herewith a copy of the suggested letter which would be acceptable in his mind.

Under separate cover I am forwarding you two copies of the report furnished me by Dr. Melville Jacobs on his return from his inspection tour of Cobalt Bomb installation, and especially noted are his notes regarding his visit to Oak Ridge and Dr. Brucer.

The cooperation of the City of Hope with the School is expected to function in this Cobalt Bomb Project with the same informal arrangements (as far as Regents are concerned) as already exist in our Cancer Research Program. This cooperation is expected to extend throughout the questions of staffing and financing the Project.

As seen from Dr. Jacobs report, the Project to be assigned consists of an evaluation of a 200-curie Cobalt Bomb. This Bomb, when established at the City of Hope, will be available for use not only in experimental therapy on patients but also for determination of physical measurement and for studying its effects on experimental tumors in animals (Carpenter's and Kinoshita's problems).

Personnel at present available at the City of Hope consists of

- 1) Dr. Melville Jacobs (although Dr. Jacobs is on half-time status, he has indicated that he will put in as much time on this Project as is necessary for him to do).
- 2) Dr. Herman Nussbaum, Diplomate of the Board of Radiology, full time. (I would judge that he would have almost half time which he could devote to this Project.)
- 3) Dr. Raymond Finkle, physicist, part time. (It is estimated that he could spend as much as half time on this Project.)
- 4) Experienced technicians in high voltage therapy - two, both of which could devote half time to this Project.

In the event of further technical or medical assistants that might be required in this Project, the City of Hope will obtain these in consultation with the Medical School.

The 200-curie Source Project is to be preliminary to a 1200-curie Source Bomb, which, according to information now available from the A. E. C., would be available 1½ to 2 years from now. The 200-curie Source would, in all probability, be available in 3 to 4 months.
