Through the operation of the hospital, the Holston Conference of the Methodist Church has usurped the unlimited power to tax the sick without accounting for the disposition of the proceeds.

We believe that the Oak Ridge Hospital of the Methodist Church is charging patients at least \$20.00 more for hospital services than is necessary to meet expenses. This unnecessary burden on the sick violates humanitarian principles, and repudiates the pledged word of the spokesmen for The Holston Conference in the referendum.

We believe that action by duly elected City Councilmen is the only way to bring relief from this most critical situation, and the candidates are being asked to pledge their support of such action, if elected.
