MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: (Uncl) Visit With Dr. Wilson, WSEG

1. Colonel Clark and Lt Col Van Auken visited Dr. Wilson, Weapons Systems Evaluation Group, Department of Defense, on 26 January 1953 for the purpose of briefing Dr. Wilson on the USAF BW-CW Committee being appointed by the Secretary of the Air Force and to request his cooperation in furnishing the Committee any help they might need from the weapons Systems Evaluation Group.
