The meeting was called to order by Colonel Seitzman, Chairman.

The resignation and eminent departure of Major Liff was formally announced, effective 31 August 1965.

Captain Wagner's credentials and qualifications were reviewed by the Committee, and all agreed that the training received at this hospital, as well as at Wilford Hall, U. S. Air Force Hospital, constituted more than adequate training to qualify him as the new principle user and Chief, Radioisotope Clinic.

Captain Wagner was accepted formally by the Committee as the new principle user. All procedures will be performed directly under his supervision, except the use of colloidal solutions, which will be performed under the direct supervision of Colonel Seitzman, until it is judged that adequate experience has been gained by Dr. Wagner.


Captain Wagner will officially assume the duty as Chief, Radioisotope Clinic, on 1 September 1965, upon completion of an Internal Medicine Residency.

Colonel Paul V. Kiehl, MC, Chief, Department of Surgery, was announced as a new member of the Committee. He replaces Colonel Edward H. Vogel, MC.

It was also mentioned that Captain Richard J. McGuire, MC, and Captain Richard D. Patterson, MC, had been assigned TDY, Brooke General Hospital, to learn the teaching and medical use of isotopes; and it was felt by the Committee that our staff, personnel, and facilities were more than adequate to fulfill requirements sufficient for the operation of the Radioisotope Clinic at U. S. Army Hospital, Ft. Sill, Oklahoma.

This meeting was not intended to replace the regular quarterly meeting, which will be held in September 1965.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 1200 hours.
