I was very disappointed to have missed you in Berkeley at Christmas time, as I had a hundred things to ask you about, but hope you and the family had marvellous fun in the Canadian snow. We took so long in getting back here from California that we have had only two weekends of skiing - at Col des Gets, Villars and Megève. Speaking of snow, next time you go to Nepal don't do as we did and allow only a few days in the Katmandu valley (although that alone is worth the trip); take time and explore the country. Are you climbing in the Himalayas with Will Siri et al next year?

What I am really writing about is radioactive poisoning. I heard a little from [REDACTED] and a bit from [REDACTED] to the effect that you have had some interesting experiences with contamination. I would certainly like to know something about this and what you have learned. Also, what is the latest on [REDACTED] Are you still following him; what is he putting out in his urine; how much does he have in his hand and how is it changing; what does he have in his skeleton? Have you heard anything from [REDACTED]

Hope to see you some time, some place, and in the meantime I would appreciate immensely your giving me a word or two regarding experiences you have had with contamination cases since 1957. Who else in the States has had such experience recently?
