Dear Mr. Bolton:

As you know, the project under AEC Contract AT(04-1)GEN-12 with the University of California at Los Angeles has been the subject of comprehensive review during the past several months. It now appears that we are in a position to extend this contract through September 30, 1972, subject to mutual acceptance of a number of points enumerated below. All or most of these items have been discussed with the Commission and the Joint Committee on Atomic Energy, and their adoption is considered essential for the revitalization of this valuable laboratory asset.

1. See Attachment A - Article III, Term. This is a revision of the present contract article and is intended to provide for extension of the contract through September 30, 1972, subject, however, to annual reviews by the Commission, with a major review to take place approximately late in 1969. It further indicates the possibility of earlier expiration should the circumstances warrant such action.
2. Acceptance by both parties of Amendment No. 1 to Memorandum of Understanding between the Regents of the University of California and the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission which provides for

certain organizational changes including provision for award under the contract of five FTK regular faculty positions (may be utilized for up to ten individuals) in any appropriate department of the Los Angeles Campus and, in recognition of the multi-disciplinary character of the Laboratory, provides for the Director of the Laboratory to be responsible administratively directly to the Chancellor, along with other appropriate language changes previously discussed.

3. The recommendations of the Division of Biology and Medicine were reviewed and approved by the Commission, and the following actions are proposed:

- a. The appointment of Dr. O. R. Lunt as Director of the Laboratory of Nuclear Medicine and Radiation Biology by the Regents of the University of California be approved by the Atomic Energy Commission.
- b. The extension of the contract for a five-year period (retroactive to the last comparable period ending September 30, 1967) as provided for in item 1 above.
- c. The Director of the Laboratory is to establish regular meetings with his external advisory committee to advise him on the plans he and his staff have developed for new personnel programs and organization.
- d. As indicated in item 1 above, the Division of Biology and Medicine will conduct an annual review of the Laboratory, to

be performed by an ad hoc committee of appropriate experts to be appointed by the Director, DBM. A major review will be scheduled at an appropriate time late in 1969 for the purpose of determining that the Laboratory is in fact achieving its role for the AEC and UCLA.

- e. In the course of the annual reviews, it is agreed that discussions will be held with the Chancellor including, among other things, the status of a plan to increase the support of the Laboratory with UCLA-budgeted funds, particularly relating to a progressive increase in the number of staff with University tenure positions and funding.
- f. Of particular importance and pending the passage of a suitable resolution by the University of California Senate or adoption of other appropriate regulations by the University is agreement that suitable arrangements will be established to provide for the interests of non-senate staff employed by the Laboratory and a means for redress of their grievances.

We believe that our mutual agreement to adopt the above proposed measures and conditions will enable us to move ahead toward a viable and beneficial laboratory.

After you and your colleagues have had an opportunity to consider the above, I would appreciate your contacting me for the purpose of arranging such a meeting at a mutually convenient date to discuss these matters.

ARTICLE III - TERM

1. The term of this contract is extended to midnight, September 30, 1972, provided, however, that the work and activities of the Laboratory under or in connection with this contract or its objectives (i) will be reviewed annually by the Commission, and particularly in context of the Commission's overall program and of considerations respecting appropriation of funds and (ii) will be subjected to a major review by the Commission approximately late in 1969. The Commission shall have the right, based upon the results of any such review, to elect to exercise its right to terminate under the article captioned "Termination or Expiration," and, notwithstanding paragraph 1 a. of said article, without giving the advance notice thereon specified; such termination shall be effective upon the date specified in a written notice from the Commission to the University to that effect received by the University prior to the said specified effective date of termination.
2. This contract is also subject to termination pursuant to the provisions of the article captioned "Termination or Expiration."
