SUBJECT: Request for Human Subjects Committee Approval for Proposal of Collaborative Work with University of Washington

This memorandum is to clarify the present status of the proposed collaborative work with the University of Washington.

On March 7, 1977 a meeting of the LLL Human Subjects Committee was convened to review the request for use of human subjects in this proposed work titled, "Ozone Effects on Overall and Regional Lung Function." After much discussion the Committee decided not to approve the use of human subjects at that time. The Committee requested to meet with Mike Morgan and Rich Holub to further discuss some questions which had been raised by the members of the Committee. Several attempts were made to arrange a mutually satisfactory meeting time. Due to tight schedules of the two scientists from Washington, and time restraints necessarily imposed by Committee members I was unable to arrange a second Committee meeting for discussion of this project.

Dr. Max Biggs requested from you and Robert Frank additional information on this proposal. On April 18, 1977 I received a memorandum from Dr. Biggs enclosing the information he obtained. However, there is one page missing from the copy of the human subjects approval. I have talked with Dr. Robert Frank, he will see that I obtain a complete copy of the human subjects approval from the University of Washington. As soon as this material is received and distributed to the members of the Human Subjects Committee, I will call a meeting to further discuss this proposal.
