Dear Dave:

The current problem of the Radioisotope Committee still sits as unfinished business. Apparently our efforts during the past year to streamline this situation did not result in any great success or splash. Hence, I believe it advisable to analyze the situation as it now exists, and set up a specific, workable type of small committee which will not only serve the purpose of accepting the responsibility, but also satisfy the requirements of the Division on Licensing and Procurement of the Atomic Energy Commission.

My suggestion is that a standard type of committee be set up consisting of members of the departments of Physics, Chemistry and Biology in the School of Arts and Sciences, the School of Engineering and Optics, and a member from the departments of Physiology and Radiation Biology of the Medical School. This will provide no overlap with the separate committee on human use in which other university departments are represented.

With the appointment of President Wallis it may be possible to develop the new scheme at leisure. If it would be possible to have specific authorization for this proposal, invitations could be either forwarded from your office or from this office within a short period of time.

If you have any questions about this procedure do not hesitate to advise. However, so much time has elapsed trying to specifically arrange the other, it may be expedient to go ahead with the standard plan used in most universities as far as we can tell.
