program: William Shatner's "*Weird or What*". Ed Boucheron (5732) has identified two images from
Sandia's Corporate Image collection—Csandia--that include the Bhangmeter. The bhangmeter is
discussed on p. 112 of the general history book, Sandia National Laboratories: A History of Exceptional
