AS 68: Facility Protection

- Initial JAEA-SNL discussion of possible new collaboration topics (June 2007)
 - Vulnerability assessment of future Category I facilities
 - Guard post optimization and automated access control
 - Video intrusion detection and tracking
- JAEA plans to proceed with Projects 2 and 3 and to consider further Project 1 (July 2007)
- SNL has done some preliminary planning for cooperation on Projects 2 and 3
- DOE decision for SNL to proceed is pending
- AS 68 decision: Recommend close AS 68 at this PCG meeting
- Continue this collaboration under a new work structure

Future PP Cooperation

- DOE plans to continue to collaborate with JAEA in the area of physical protection of nuclear materials
- DOE would like to work with JAEA to define and establish a new structure for our physical protection collaboration
- The goals for this new work structure are to be simple, flexible and timely and to meet both parties' internal process requirements

- Topics for discussion at that meeting will include:
 - Details of a new DOE-JAEA physical protection collaboration work structure
