# RED TEAM 2007

**Anticipate Your Adversaries**

The ability to anticipate an opponent's malicious intent is critical to many forms of planning, analysis, design, and operations. While this need is recognized in the military and intelligence communities, infrastructure providers and first responders find themselves on the front line facing a range of potential threats that in many cases exceed the defenders' direct experience. **REDTEAM2007** acknowledges this need and seeks to match need with experience.

At the conference, representatives from the military, intelligence community, federal agencies, infrastructure providers, and first responders will have the chance to interact with and learn from professional red teamers from a breadth of organizations. Likewise, professional red teamers will have the chance to learn from infrastructure providers and first responders and share strategies and lessons learned. In addition, attendees will participate in the Sandia National Laboratories Red Teaming for Program Managers (RT4PM) class, perhaps the best introduction to understanding and managing red teaming available today.

## Topics and tracks:

The conference will address two broad application areas: (a) red teaming and adversary-based assessments and (b) adversary modeling. Within and across these areas, speakers will address topics such as

### Methods, techniques, and tools (the technical track)

- Characterizing, modeling, and understanding adversaries
- Exploring, modeling, and analyzing possible adversary actions
- Testing and assuring designs and prototypes
- Testing and assuring live or operational systems and organizations

### Program and project management (the managerial track)

- Building, training, and running red teams
- Identifying and sharing best practices
- Overcoming organizational risks and challenges; identifying and measuring rewards

### Information sharing within organizations and across sectors (the policy track)

## Who should attend?

- Federal, state, and local officials responsible for homeland security, infrastructure protection, and law enforcement
- Military organizations responsible for homeland security, infrastructure protection, and force protection
- Military and intelligence organizations responsible for characterizing adversaries, assessing vulnerabilities, and red teaming
- Commercial providers of red teaming services to military and government clients and critical infrastructure owners
- Commercial infrastructure providers
